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

The Arizona Corporation Commission regulates sixteen electric power, distribution companies, and cooperatives across Arizona. It reviews utility resource plans and completes biennial transmission assessments and summer preparedness workshops on an ongoing basis to determine whether Arizona's existing resource portfolios and transmission systems will be adequate to safely and reliably meet the State's energy needs. It also evaluates utilities' resource selections and fuel mixes to determine which will be deemed prudent for purposes of future recovery in rate cases. Arizona's leaders are invited to join the Commission for a Virtual Summit on March 18th to hear from the industry regarding the Commission's current resource planning process and concerns arising from recent events in California and Texas.
